Aims and Outcomes

Aims	The aim of this module is to develop pharmacists to facilitate effective prescribing considering clinical, ethical and legal factors, and prescribing in a wider contextlf undertaken with modules 7111CPPHAR (Therapeutics in Specialist Clinical Practice) and 7114CPPHAR (Clinical Skills), students can gain a Certificate in Independent Prescribing. The module requires students to demonstrate learning outcomes, via signoff by their Designated Medical Practitioner and through portfolio entries and other activities.
