Aims and Outcomes

Aims	This programme will critically examine the principles of disclosure, taking the student through a structured, methodical process, discussing the common law principles that apply, the statutory law as set out in the Criminal Procedure and Investigations Act 1996 and the supporting Code of Practice. The module will explore the role and responsibilities of investigators, disclosure officers and the Senior Investigating Officer, the disclosure tests contained within the legislation and the requirements placed on the prosecution and the defence. It will also evaluate the disclosure tests contained within the Criminal Procedure and Investigations Act 1996 and the requirements placed on the prosecution and the defence. There will be a focus on managing disclosure in complex cases, the scheduling of material, dealing with sensitive material, the application of Public Interest Immunity (PII) and considerations around third-party material. The programme will examine how the Investigating Officer (IO) / Senior Investigating Officer (SIO) will implement and develop strategies to deal with unused material, it will also deal with strategic issues including the role of the CPS as the prosecuting authority.
