Outline Syllabus	Bowel cancer and polyps: epidemiology. aetiology, pathology, investigations, diagnosis, treatments and outcomes. The NHS Cancer Plan, The National Bowel Cancer Screening Programme: its development, implementation management and evaluation strategies. NIHCE / BSG guidelines. An overview of other gastro-intestinal disorders that may influence presentation and endoscopy findings. Other medical, psychological and social problems that may influence the diagnostic and treatment pathway. Total case management of patients to include history taking, assessment, decision-making and evaluation. Patient preparation for diagnostic investigations to include bowel preparation, consent for colonoscopy or alternative diagnostic investigations and fitness for sedation. Understanding colonoscopy reports. Decision-making following colonoscopy. Roles and responsibilities of primary, secondary and tertiary care, and public health departments in relation to bowel cancer screening. Advanced communication, interpersonal skills, barriers to effective communication, breaking bad news, patient empowerment, patient advocacy, equality and diversity, health promotion. Health and Safety. Legal, ethical and regulatory framework behind consent. The role of specialist palliative care. Clinical Governance issues and service delivery. Quality assurance processes. Associated research and evidence based practice, future developments and practice. Models of Reflection, Portfolio development, learning agreements, self directed learning, study skills
Module Overview	This module is to specifically to prepare those of you appointed into a specialist screening Post within a NHS Bowel Screening Center.
Additional Information	This module is to specifically to prepare practitioners appointed into a specialist screening Post within a NHS Bowel Screening Centre. Teaching will take place on site, the students will return to their practice settings to reflect upon and develop expertise within their own settings supported by a mentor/facilitator .The module learning outcomes and relevant subject benchmark statements are in line with the QAA framework for higher education qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. The module is aligned to the Level 7 descriptors for a Level 7 Higher Education Qualification. The module is a part time course delivered over a standard year, with three intakes per year, September, November and March. The criteria for admission to the module is that candidates are currently working as a registered professional in a relevant area of practice. Ideally candidates will have studied at degree (level 6) however if this is not the case the applicants skills and professional experience will be discussed to allow the module leader to assess capability to study at level 7The final award is a Continuing Professional Development – Specialist Bowel Cancer Screening Practitioner (25314)The students have access to Canvas and the University's other range of electronic support such as access to the electronic library facilities. The students also have access to the module leader through phone contact, emails and face to face meetings. A module guide is also provided which guides students to the wider range of support available.
