Notes

This option module is in option group E, as decribed in the programme specification, and should not be combined with other modules in this group.

Project Management requires project management knowledge, transferable skills, such as presenting, and the ability to use project management tools, such as MS Project.

The assessment of learning will include a group submission involving the simulation of

a project team at the Project Initiation stage, with students working together to plan

and define a project of their choice, which has been developed through the seminars as topics are considered. Project teams are required to present a project for approval to a simulated project board. Formative activity extending the learning will include the unassessed presentation of a Project Brief to allow formative feedback on the development of the case study project.

A PRINCE2 Project Initiation Document is part of the group assessment of learning with a critical review of a live or case study project being the individual assessment of learning.
