Aims	1. To explore definitions, models and pathways of psycho-spiritual transformation across a range of applied domains. 2. To develop personal competence in the application of transpersonal approaches in a practice context relevant to the student. 3. To explore issues of measurement and frameworks for understanding individual and collective transformation and what fosters it. 4. To examine critically how the above issues of measurement and explanation can be applied with respect to two areas (available from a range offered as optional topics within the module) that exemplify approaches in which transpersonal principles inform practice.
