### **Outline Syllabus**

Research paradigms: the nature of educational/professional research activity and its relationship to concepts of professionalism, quantitative and qualitative methodologies, case study, action research and other approaches. Ethical issues in researching professional practice. Selected research methods (design of research instruments and analysis and interpretation) drawn from the following:- The use of literature and other documentary evidence- Selected statistical techniques including consideration of the use of quantitative surveys/questionnaires - The use of surveys/questionnaires to collect qualitative data- The use of interviews/focus groups - The use of observation techniques- Issues related to validity, reliability, objectivity and subjectivity- Approaches to reporting and disseminating research
